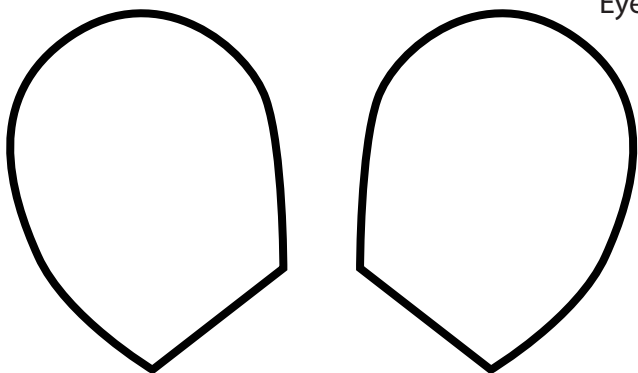
Inner Ear: Suggested color -- Pink



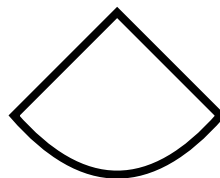
Eyebrows: Suggested color -- Orange



Bottom Lip: Suggested color -- Yellow



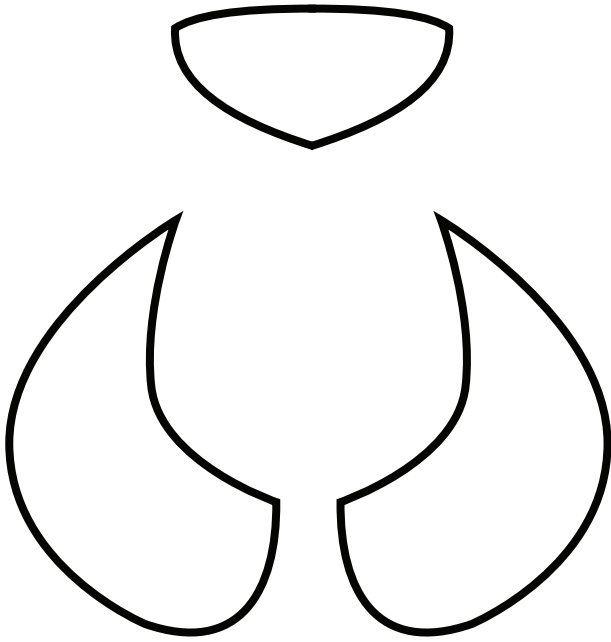
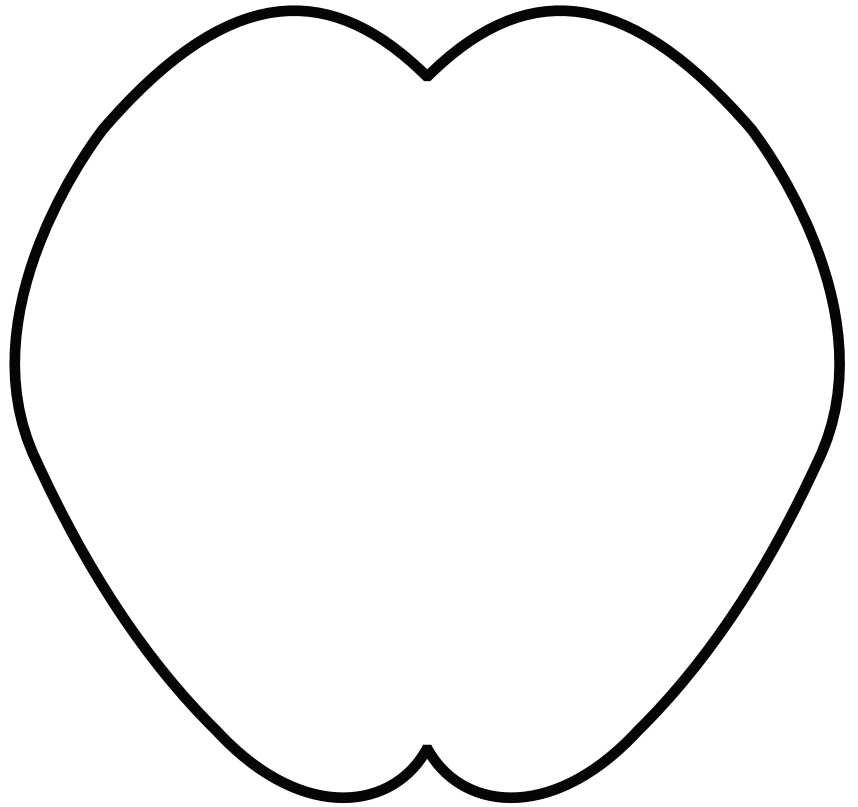

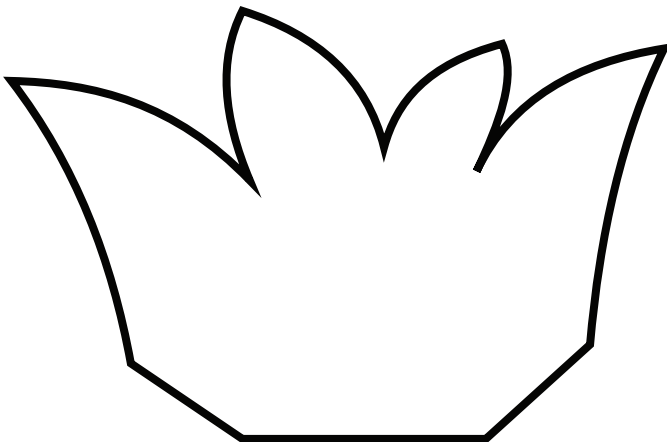

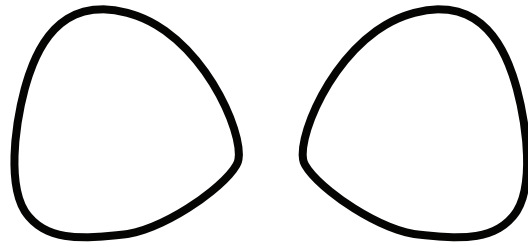

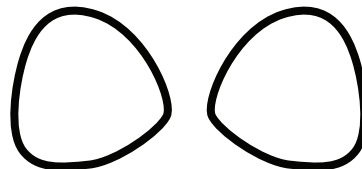
